

## MATH 1113 Where Do I Go From Here?

All students at Kennesaw State University are required to take at least 2 mathematics courses. Your current course will meet the math requirement for Area A in General Education. The next math course you take is required for Area D.

The Department of Mathematics and Statistics strongly recommends that you register for your next mathematics course during Priority Registration. The reasons for this recommendation are:

- It is best to take your next class while your skills are still fresh and sharp from this current experience.
- Several majors require the Area D mathematics course as a prerequisite for major courses or for admission to the major.
- Using Priority Registration is the best way to insure you will obtain a seat in these courses which tend to be full when Add/Drop comes around.

Below is a table of Area D courses which are accessible from MATH 1113. Also included in the table is some advice on which students should take each courses.

| Course Number | Course Name                                | Who should take it  |
|---------------|--|---|
| MATH 1190     | Calculus I                                 | Required for students whose major is Biology, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Biochemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science and Mathematics or Science Education. |
| MATH 1106     | Elementary Applied Calculus                | Required for students with majors in Business, Information Systems or Information Security. MATH 1190 is also acceptable for these majors.                |
| MATH 1107     | Elementary Statistics                      | Recommended for students with majors in Health and Human Services (including Nursing majors), Arts and Humanities.  |
| MATH 2207     | Data Analysis and Probability for Teachers | Recommended for students in all education majors except Secondary Mathematics Education   |
